NEW HAMPSHIRE TO ADD TOLL-BOOTHS ON 1-95

New Hampshire officials approved a plan to spend more than \$6 million to add tollbooths in the city of Hampton at the junction of Route 101 and Interstate 95 in the southeast corner of the state, the Associated Press reported.

Gov. Craig Benson and the Executive Council approved the plan, which would add one tollbooth southbound and two tollbooths northbound — bringing the total number of booths at the Hampton Toll Plaza to eight, AP said.

State transportation officials said the improvements would ease congestion at the toll plaza on I-95. Work should be completed by next fall.

ONBOARD RECORDERS

Two days after it asked a court to stay an order vacating new hours-of-service (HOS) rules for truck drivers, the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration gave advanced notice of a proposed rule focusing on using electronic onboard recorders to improve HOS compliance.

The notice in Wednesday's Federal Register said that technological advancements since the government last addressed the issue of onboard recorders in 1984 made it appropriate to explore them again.

David Longo, FMCSA spokesman, told Transport Topics the

recorders would allow for easier enforcement of HOS rules. It would also lead to better health for drivers, he said.

"Driver compliance with the hours-of-service rules would help to ensure that the physical condition of commercial motor vehicle drivers is adequate to enable them to operate the vehicles safely," the notice said.

"In short, FMCSA is attempting to evaluate the suitability of Electronic On Board Recorders to demonstrate compliance with and enforcement of the hours-of-service regulations, which in turn have major implications for the welfare of drivers and the safe operation of commercial motor vehicles," FMCSA said.

The ban on these truck has been lifted from the end of the Maine Turnpike north on I95 to exit 113 only.



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AUGUSTA MEMORIAL BRIDGE TEMPORARY CLOSURE - 3 OR 4 DAYS BEGINNING DECEMBER 1ST

The Augusta Memorial Bridge will be temporarily closed for structural repairs beginning December 1st. This temporary closure will last only 3 or 4 days and will take place after the opening of the Augusta Third Bridge, which will provide an additional route across the Kennebec River into the future.

The short-term bridge closure in December will also allow MaineDOT to assess traffic impacts in advance of the longer-term repair and re-decking procedure planned for Spring/Summer 2005.

MaineDOT will use a variety of methods to gather feedback on the public's experience during December's 3-4 day temporary closure, so that we can determine the best approach to traffic management during the more extensive repairs to Memorial Bridge next year.

Please consider alternate routes during the required Augusta Memorial Bridge closure in December:

For most traffic , the two recommended routes across the Kennebec River will be the new Augusta Third Bridge and the Gardiner/Randolph Bridge.

Downtown Augusta businesses will remain open and accessible throughout the closure, and the Father Curran Bridge can be used to reach them.



As of today, the Turnpike Authority opened the new Exit 86 in Sabattus to all traffic.

As of November 20th, the Maine Turnpike Authority by agreement with the Maine Department of Transportation (MDOT) will extend to the "New Bridge" in Augusta. Thus, 100,000 pound six-axle combination units will be able to use that portion of the highway from Exit 109 to the new exit

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES BANS MEXICAN TRUCKS

The omnibus spending bill passed by the House of Representatives Nov. 20. contains a provision aimed at restricting Mexican trucks from entering the U.S. in accordance with the North American Free Trade Agreement of 1993.

The provision was sponsored by Rep. John Olver, D-Mass.

Olver inserted the amendment to restrict foreign trucks citing safety reasons rather than environmental considerations that had been at issue earlier.

The bill passed 339-70, but the truck provision might not survive a House-Senate conference, according to NewsMax.com, an on-line news source.

The Supreme Court in June ruled that the Bush administration had the authority to lift a moratorium on Mexican, a defeat for groups seeking to ban Mexican trucks from U.S. roads.

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REGULATION OF THE MONTH

§ 396.25 Qualifications of brake inspectors.

- (a) The motor carrier shall ensure that all inspections, maintenance, repairs or service to the brakes of its commercial motor vehicles, are performed in compliance with the requirements of this section.
- (b) For purposes of this section, brake inspector means any employee of a motor carrier who is responsible for ensuring all brake inspections, maintenance, service, or repairs to any commercial motor vehicle, subject to the motor carrier's control, meet the applicable Federal standards.
- (c) No motor carrier shall require or permit any employee who does not meet the minimum brake inspector qualifications of § 396.25(d) to be responsible for the inspection, maintenance, service or repairs of any brakes on its commercial motor vehicles.
- (d) The motor carrier shall ensure that each brake inspector

is qualified as follows:

- (d)(1) Understands the brake service or inspection task to be accomplished and can perform that task; and
- (d)(2) Is knowledgeable of and has mastered the methods, procedures, tools and equipment used when performing an assigned brake service or inspection task; and
- (d)(3) Is capable of performing the assigned brake service or inspection by reason of experience, training or both as follows:

(d)(3)(i) Has successfully completed an apprenticeship program sponsored by a State, a Canadian Province, a Federal agency or a labor union, or a training program approved by a State, Provincial or Federal agency, or has a certificate from a State or Canadian Province which qualifies the person to perform the assigned brake service or inspection task (including passage of Commercial Driver's License air brake tests in the case of a brake inspection); or (d)(3)(ii) Has brake-related training or experience or a combination thereof totaling at least one year. Such training or experience may consist of:



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- (A) Participation in a training program sponsored by a brake or vehicle manufacturer or similar commercial training program designed to train students in brake maintenance or inspection similar to the assigned brake service or inspection tasks; or
- (B) Experience performing brake maintenance or inspection similar to the assigned brake service or inspection task in a motor carrier maintenance program; or
- (C) Experience performing brake maintenance or inspection similar to the assigned brake service or inspection task at a commercial garage, fleet leasing company, or similar facility.
- (e) No motor carrier shall employ any person as a brake inspector unless the evidence of the inspector's qualifications, required under this section is maintained by the motor carrier at its principal place of business, or at the location at which the brake inspector is employed. The evidence must be maintained for the period during which the brake inspector is employed in that capacity and for one year thereafter. However, motor carriers do not have to maintain evidence of qualifications to inspect air brake systems for such inspections performed by persons who have passed the air brake knowledge and skills test for a Commercial Driver's License.
