Maine Trucking for Kids Convoy

This year the Convoy raised \$11,200 of which \$9,000 went to Camp Sunshine and \$2,200 went to local Police Department Youth Programs such as D.A.R.E., Explorer and other programs. The presentation of the funds was held on October 29th at Camp Sunshine's facility in Casco.

For the 6th year in a row the event was held at Scarborough Downs. The facility and hospitality there were fantastic. If only we could get them to stop the rain from falling each year, it would be perfect. All activities except the actual convoy and the driving competition were held inside this year. The event was co-chaired by **Kevin Battle** of the South Portland Police Department representing the Lions Clubs and **Denis Litalien** of **Clifford W. Trooper Frank Mongue Retires

The Maine State Police announce the retirement of four veteran troopers, as of the end of August, including Trooper Frank Mongue of Springvale. Frank served 30 years, having joined the department in 1979. Since 1986, Mongue had been in the commercial vehicle enforcement section, inspecting tractor trailers and the men and women who operate them. Many of our members interacted with Frank at the York and Kittery scale houses.

Rt. 302 Fatality

Authorities have identified the motorist killed in a crash on Route 302 in Naples in December as a Gray man who was driving for UPS. Shannon B. Ronan, 44, was driving west and had stopped to take a left turn when he was hit from behind by a cable company utility truck, according to the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office.

The collision drove the UPS delivery van into oncoming traffic where it collided with an eastbound tractor trailer truck hauling propane, the sheriff's office said. The crash occurred at 1101 Roosevelt Trail, which is also Route 302. The tractor trailer was driven by Dewight Pickard, 54, and is owned by Pickard Transportation Inc.

No charges have been brought in the case which is being investigated by the sheriff's office, the State Police commercial vehicle enforcement unit and an accident reconstruction team from the Windham Police Department.

Increased Weight Limits

Trucks over 80,000 pounds will now be allowed on I-95 from Augusta to Houlton as President Obama signed a bill allowing a one year test program. Senator Susan Collins, who was instrumental in getting the legislation through the legislative process, says that there will be a study of the pilot program's effect on safety, commerce and wear-and-tear. The bill also allows heavier trucks to use Vermont's interstate highways.

Maine Using Cameras, Scales to Catch Weight Violators

The Maine Department of Transportation has installed cameras and scales in an attempt to catch weight violations in trucks that avoid a weigh station on Interstate 95, the Portsmouth (N.H.) Herald reported in September. The system uses cameras and scales on Route 236 in Eliot and on Route 1 in York.

If the York weigh station on southbound I-95 in open, the scales will look for trucks in violation of weight regulations, while the cameras will take photos of the trucks, the Herald said. State police can then take appropriate action against the violators.

The scales and cameras are part of a \$2 million project by the Maine officials in cooperation with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, the Herald said. In another part of the project, the I-95 weigh station is now equipped with technology that allows state police to enter truck information more quickly, in an effort to reduce backup.

Lt. Thomas Kelly of Lewiston has been named a vice president for the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance (CVSA), which promotes truck safety in North America. Kelly was named VP at the group's annual meeting in Baltimore. CVSA is made up of motor carrier safety officials from the 50 states, Canada, and Mexico. FMCSA to Reconsider HOS Rule

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration has agreed to reconsider, and potentially change, its oft-challenged hours-of-service rule for commercial drivers, putting on hold a federal court challenge by a coalition of interest groups.

The agreement, filed at the end of October, gives FMCSA nine months to submit its review to the White House and up to 21 months to issue a new final rule to replace the current one. Until that time, the current rule remains in effect.

National Driver of the Year

In September, the American Trucking Associations has named Keith Suits of the Rite Aid Distribution Center in Rome. New York as its National Driver of the Year. Keith has spent nearly three million miles behind the wheel and has never gotten into an accident or received a citation.

Keith spends a lot of time doing charity events and does the No Zone Trailer and Share the Road program with the New York State Motor Truck Association where he goes to schools and teaches kids about truck safety and blind spots.

Volvo to Continue Sponsorship of America's Road Team

Volvo Trucks North America will continue to sponsor American Trucking Associations' America's Road Team for its 2010 season, the truck maker said in October. "We view America's Road Team as one of the most important proactive safety efforts in existence today," Scott Kress, Volvo Trucks senior vice president of sales and marketing, said in a statement. Volvo is the sole sponsor of America's Road Team.

The Road Team uses a Volvo tractor to bring ATA's image trailer to events around the country, educating the public about the trucking industry, Volvo said. ATA selects 18 truck drivers, known in the program as captains, to tour the country for two years and serve as ambassadors for the industry.

Stimulus Funds 10,000th Highway **Project, DOT Says**

On December 28th, Transportation Secretary Ray La-Hood said that the Federal Highway Administration has approved 10,000 highway projects funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, marking "a major milestone in creating jobs and improving the nation's infrastructure."

"What better way to cap off the year than with 10,000 highway and bridge projects putting people back to work, strengthening the economy, and making travel safer for everyone," LaHood said in a statement. \$21.8 billion has been obligated to 10,000 projects nationwide for highway projects through the act, also known informally as the stimulus package.

N.J. Enacts Law on Snow Removal from Vehicles

New Jersey Gov. Jon Corzine signed a law in October that would set fines for vehicles with "dangerous accumulations" of snow or ice on them, though enforcement will not begin for a year, the As-- from Transport Topics Online | sociated Press reported. Fines will range from \$25 to \$75 and the enforcement grace period will allow truckers time install snow-clearing equipment, AP said. The law is believed to be the first of its kind in the nation, though New Jersey and several other states already have laws that impose stiff fines on drivers if snow flies from their vehicles and causes damage or an injury.


