FMCSA Advisory Committee Recommends Driver Training

This past year a training advisory panel voted 24-2 to recommend a requirement that in addition to classroom time, new truck drivers would be required to complete at least 30 hours of behind-the-wheel instruction. The requirement also would allow a flexible split that would include a minimum of 10 hours of range driving instruction and at least 10 hours of on-road instruction.

Among the committee's recommendations was a long list of stringent classroom requirements, in addition to the 30 hours of on-road instruction for Class A commercial driver license training. For Class B CDLs, the requirements included classroom instruction and 15 hours of driving instruction, seven of which must be on road.

In attempting to define an entry-level driver, the committee decided that the agency should not require drivers whose CDL lapsed with a good driving record to take a refresher course before retesting for their CDLs.

Larry Minor, FMCSA's associate administrator for policy, lauded the work of the panel, saying he was convinced this time the panel's recommendations will help the agency formulate a successful rule.

Florida is handling cell phone violations pretty stringently. They fine the driver \$500 for the first violation, \$1500 for the 2nd, and \$2500 for the 3rd. In addition, it carries 10 points, which, amounts to 30 points on the company's CSA (no change there). The tickets go before an Administrative Law and they typically don't negotiate these (though our attorneys are willing to try). They may expand this to the entire country. May They Rest in Peace

Two past Presidents of the Maine Motor Transport Association recently passed away.

Richard Haley of Haley the Mover served as President from 1973 through 1975 and passed away Jan. 21, while **Arthur Hicks** of CB Kenworth, who served as President from 1981 to 1983 passed away on February 9.



Rick Wickman, a driver for Roadway Express, also passed away recently. He was an active member of the New Hampshire Professional Drivers Association and was a 2-time State Champion. He was also named NH Driver of the year in 2004 and was seen each year at he Northeast Charity Challenge. Rick was 58 years old and suffered from Mesothelioma.

Did you know......

- * Based on fatal accident reports, NHTSA data shows that at least 3,154 people were killed in crashes involving all distracted drivers in 2013, including those who were texting and driving. * NHTSA estimates that 424,000 Americans were injured in all distraction-affected crashes in 2013.
- * Ten percent of fatal crashes, 18 percent of injury crashes, and 16 percent of all motor vehicle traffic crashes in 2013 were reported as distraction-affected crashes, which are defined as any crash in which a driver was identified as distracted at the time of the crash.
- * Ten percent of all drivers 15 to 19 years old involved in fatal crashes were reported as distracted at the time of the crashes. This age group has the largest proportion of drivers who were distracted at the time of the crash.
- * 244 Americans aged 15 to 19 were killed in distraction-affected crashes.
- * In 2013, there were 480 non-occupants killed in distraction-affected crashes.

DVIR News

As a reminder of the following rule change regarding DVIR's:

U.S. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx announced last year that professional truck drivers will no longer have to comply with a burdensome daily paperwork requirement. Eliminating DVIRs when no safety defects or mechanical deficiencies are identified will result in time savings valued at \$1.7 billion dollars annually without compromising safety.

Commercial truck drivers will still be required to conduct pre- and post-trip inspections of their vehicles to identify any safety defects or maintenance concerns. The final rule removes the requirement that drivers file a report when equipment problems or safety concerns are not identified. Even with the rule in effect, companies may still choose to require documentation but will not be required by law to do so.

Interesting Note from a Member....

Board Appointments

Member **Ron Round** was appointed to the Advisory Board at the Northeast Penobscot Tech Region 3. This allows them to get Ron's 27 years of driving and experiences into their truck driving school training. This happened as a result of the help Ron and other MPDA members provided for the annual student driving competition and his willingness to help the kids get ready for the State Driving Championships last spring.

Also, for those who don't remember, a bill passed many years ago requires MPDA to be represented on the Motor Carrier Review Board, a State level Board that reviews motor carrier records and recommends action against carriers whose records indicate they have become unsafe. Member **Dave Littlefield** has been re-appointed to this Board and represents MPDA in any reviews. Dave has been involved in representing MPDA for many years, having served as our Legislative Officer in the past.

Student Driving Competition

The Dick Dolloff Memorial Student Driving Competition will be held on April 13 at the Augusta Civic Center. This competition is for high school students enrolled in commercial truck driving classes at various vocational schools in Maine This event is organized and run by **Vicki Kimball**, an instructor at the Tri-County Technical Center, and sponsored by an association of these schools with assistance from the Maine Motor Transport Association, the Maine Professional Drivers Association, members of the Maine State Police and the State License Examiners.

The event is named in memory of **Dick Dolloff**, a former truck driving instructor at the Westbrook Regional Vocational Center. Dick was instrumental in starting this competition years ago as a fun and educational way for students interested in the transportation field to sharpen their skills and learn safe habits. This past year Vicki also started presenting the Chris Broderick Memorial Pre-Trip Inspection Award, in honor of **Chris Broderick**, a Westbrook instructor and MPDA member who continued Dick's efforts in the competition.

Last year, fifty-five students tested their skills in the two part competition last year and Vicki is hoping for at least as large a turnout this year. Students will have to maneuver around obstacles similar to what is required for them to pass the driving test to obtain a commercial drivers license and what they might encounter on a daily basis while driving. They will also have the pre-trip portion where they conduct a thorough pre-trip safety inspection. They compete in two classes; class B - straight truck, and class A - tractor- trailer.

The winners receive trophies and the top two finishers in each class from each school will move on the Future Truckers Competition to be held on May 21 in conjunction with the Maine Professional Drivers Championships in Bangor where students will compete side by side with professional drivers from across the state.

Vicki is looking forward to having the students compete alongside the professionals in Bangor and says, "I am really excited for Bangor, this is a priceless opportunity for these young operators and I can only hope they will realize the great influence the people they will meet can have on them, I know I certainly do."

MPDA plans to continue its program of "adopting" each of the schools and their students and having our members drop in to work with the students on the coming competition in Bangor and to develop a mentoring program. A number of drivers have already signed up for this great opportunity.


